Mrs. Jane Reeble has deep Kansas roots. A product of the Emporia public school system, Jane entered Emporia State University as a freshman many years ago. After her freshman year, she transferred to the University of Kansas to finish her baccalaureate degree. She left KU with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1952.

Soon after her graduation from Kansas, Jane returned to Emporia State University in order to be trained as a teacher. Upon earning her teaching certificate in 1953, Mrs. Reeble taught elementary school in Lawrence, Medicine Lodge, Wichita, and Topeka. She also taught elementary school at a Virginia Army base. All totaled, Jane served as a teacher for 15 years.

Jane married Barney Reeble in 1968. Like Jane, Mr. Reeble attended Emporia public schools, and he was an Emporia State graduate. At the time they were married, Barney owned the North and South Reeble's stores, as well as the Emporia Price Chopper. After wisely investing Barney's earnings from the grocery business, the Reebles were able to form the Jane and Bernard Reeble Foundation. The Foundation has been active for over 10 years, and carries out Jane's tradition of service to youth by supporting local scholarship funds and youth-serving organizations. Jane and Barney were married for 37 years until Mr. Reeble's passing in March of 2005.

Mrs. Reeble has several family members residing in the Emporia area, including her brother and sister-in-law Chuck and Doris Hanna. She also has two nephews and one niece living in Emporia, as well as two step-daughters, five step-grandchildren, and five step-great-grandchildren.

For quite some time now, Jane Reeble has been one of the most consistent and generous supporters of Emporia's youth. The scholarship programs she helps to fund for Flint Hills Technical College, Emporia State University, and Camp Alexander, in addition to her support of the local Boy Scouts, Salvation Army, Camp Wood, and countless other organizations, all contribute towards achieving a better educated citizenry for tomorrow.

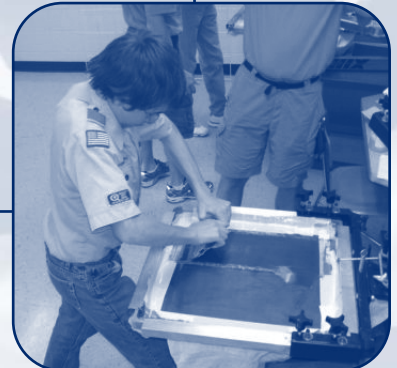
